Each local commercial station in the UK has obligations with regard to its programmes, including its music and local content. These obligations are set out in the station Format which forms part of this station's Public File.

The Public File is also available in hard copy by post upon request by any member of the public, and serves as one indicator of each station's output. Comment on the contents of the Public File should be made to the station or to the industry regulator, Ofcom.

Although Nation Radio is regional and not a local commercial station given that the station shares content and broadcast facilities with other local stations within the Nation Broadcasting group we have produced a full public file for the station.

The average number of hours of automated programming within weekday daytimes and within daytimes on Saturdays and Sundays

At Nation Radio we make full use of broadcast playout technology in order to deliver our programmes and free up presentation staff to produce content.

All programming is automated overnight (7pm – 6am)

The vast majority of our daytime programming is broadcast live including Weekdays 6am to 7pm, Saturday from 8am to 6pm. Whilst the some of our daytime programming might be considered automated under the definition published by Ofcom; relevant programme links (especially at breakfast) are normally delivered live or pre-recorded on the day of transmission.

The amount of local programming per day produced by the station

All programmes on Nation Radio is delivered locally from one of Nation Broadcasting Group's (NBG) two broadcast centres.

The broadcast centres are located within the licensed area of Pembrokeshire and Bridgend and Nation Radio is permitted to locate in either of these areas (and some others).

What our format says...

Nation Radio must broadcast 10 hours of local programming on weekdays between 06-19 including breakfast. At weekends it must broadcast 4 hours a day between 06-19.

Shared programming and content

The following programmes (or significant content from these programmes) and features are shared with other stations in the Nation Broadcasting group.

- Rugby Nation (Wednesday 1900-2000)
- Football Nation (Thursday 1900-2000)
- International news bulletins from Sky News*
- News for Wales news bulletin
- Feature content including some sport, weather, entertainment and financial news*
- Star guest interviews and relevant regional news interviews*
